
Invitation to a transformative gathering in the Amazon Rainforest

Have you ever imagined experiencing up close the culture of an ancestral people — guardians of spiritual wisdom through the plants, the sacred songs, and the forest?

We invite you to a 7-day immersion in the heart of the Amazon, on the banks of the Gregório River, at Espaço Tawahu e Família, in Yawanawá territory.

This gathering was born from the wish to bring together the Yawarani and Yawanawá families, uniting generations — from the elders who carry memory and medicine, to the younger ones who arrive bringing the fresh breath of songs and instruments.

A space of healing, knowledge, and connection, where tradition and future walk side by side, and where all who feel the call are welcome to share this sacred time.



TAWAHU & FAMILY SPACE

The Tawahu & Family Space is located on the banks of the Gregório River, in Yawanawa territory.

Founded by Tawahu Yawanawa and his wife Anna Yawanawa, the space was created with the purpose of continuing the spiritual legacy of their family and of the Yawanawa people. It is a place where ancestral memory remains alive, where elders share their knowledge and medicines, and where the new generations find inspiration to walk the path of spirituality.

At the Tawahu & Family Space, life pulses in harmony with the forest. It is where songs are raised, where planting takes place, where Uni (ayahuasca) is served, where spiritual learning diets are held, and where medicines such as rapé and sananga are shared — always in connection with the rivers, the earth, and the spirits of the forest.

More than a physical place, the space represents the continuity of a lineage and the responsibility of keeping tradition alive. It is a point of gathering, unity, and celebration, where all who feel the call are welcome to learn, experience, and walk together.





OUR HOSTS

Tawahu Yawanawá is the son of pajéYawarani and Ninonihu Yawanawá. From an early age, he grew up alongside his parents, witnessing the movements of a new time: the reawakening of Yawanawá spirituality.

Among five siblings, as the middle child, Tawahu was always close to his father and mother, closely following their teachings and experiences. In his youth, when he saw his uncle and cousin studying spirituality, he felt within himself the desire to also walk that path. At that time, there were no young spiritual students among the Yawanawá, but he recognized in himself the calling to continue the mission of his father, a great master and pajé.

At the age of 22, he began his spiritual journey. Today, at 42, he carries with him the experience of two decades of learning, witnessing, and dedication. Over this time, he has seen and lived through important transformations in his people, strengthening the certainty of his mission to preserve and reinforce this legacy.

With this purpose, he founded the Tawahu & Family Space, a place to honor the memory of his father, to teach and guide his children on this path, and to keep the history of the Yawanawá people alive.



OUR HOSTS

Anna belongs to two ethnic groups: on her mother’s side, she is Shanenawá, and on her father’s side, Yawanawá. She grew up in the village until the age of 13, when she went to live with her father. Along this she met Itawarro, with whom she married, built a family, and began a new stage of her life.

Together with him, she also entered the spiritual path. She dedicated herself to motherhood, caring for her daughters, until eventually returning to the spiritual journey alongside them. As a mother, she always encouraged and supported her daughters to follow this calling, and today, when they sing, Anna stands by them, strengthening the feminine presence and showing the power of being united.

The feminine presence is a defining mark of her path. Alongside her daughters, Anna represents the strength of women within spirituality, reinforcing a path that was once denied to them. Inspired by the first Yawanawá women warriors who broke the taboo that said women could not walk this path, she continues to expand her strength with joy, love, and courage, affirming that the feminine can and must be present.

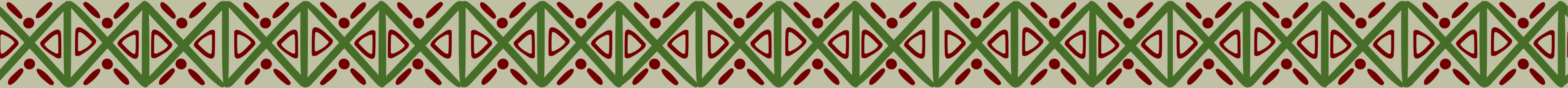

OUR HOSTS

Ninunihu Yawanawa is the daughter of Tawahu and Anna, and a young apprentice of Yawanawá spirituality. Since the age of eight, she has walked this path alongside her father, strengthening the journey of her parents, her siblings, and the space where she lives — always with humility and pride in belonging to her tradition.

Her path is deeply marked by the presence of feminine strength, which inspires her to move forward with determination and in union with her family, preserving and expanding the spiritual values she has received. She is also a great artist of her people, standing out for bringing beauty and power to the sacred songs.

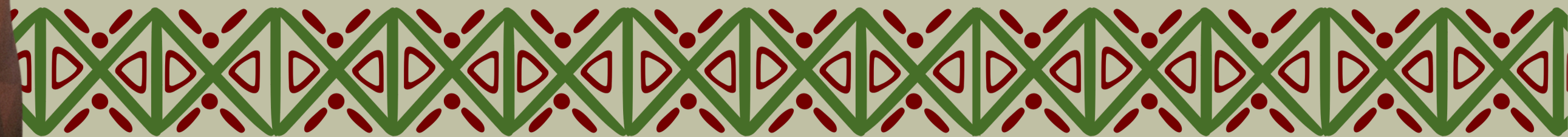


OUR HOSTS

Peshahu Yawanawa is the son of Ged and Luiza Yawanawa and the husband of Ninuninu Yawanawa. He walks firmly on the spiritual path of his people, strengthening himself each day within the tradition.

He is currently undergoing a spiritual diet, a profound process that brings learning, discipline, and strength. This choice represents a milestone in his life, a commitment to follow the spiritual path with humility and dedication.

With courage and determination, Peshahu Yawanawá seeks to honor his culture and share with those who respond to the call of the wisdom, the medicine, and the values of his tradition.





OUR HOSTS

Yaka Yawanawa is the daughter of Tawahu and Anna, and the granddaughter of pajé Yawarani and Ninia Yawanawa. From an early age, she grew up surrounded by the stories and songs of her family, being part of a lineage deeply connected to the spirituality and culture of her people.

The second daughter of the couple, Yaka stands out for her artistic sensitivity and her ability to transform feelings and experiences into creative expression. A singer and songwriter in formation, she shows great potential for developing harmonies, musical arrangements, and lyrics inspired both by Yawanawa culture and by her own life experiences.

Her path, though still young, already demonstrates the strength of one who carries an ancestral legacy, while also embodying the originality of someone who knows how to renew that legacy through art. Yaka represents the meeting point between tradition and contemporaneity, uniting the wisdom inherited from her ancestors with her singular voice that echoes the beauty and resilience of her people.



OUR HOSTS

Yawavaná Yawanawa is the daughter of pajé Yawarani and Ninunihu Yawanawa. She grew up surrounded by the teachings of her parents, learning from an early age about spirituality, the strength of the forest, and the ancestral wisdom of her people.

She currently lives with her brother at the Espaço Tawahu & Família, where she continues walking the spiritual path — learning and sharing what she has received from her family.

With humility and joy, Yawavaná seeks to pass on the teachings she learned from her father and mother, keeping alive the tradition and the truth of the Yawanawa way of life.

With an open heart, she invites everyone to come experience the forest — to feel, firsthand, the beauty and reality of living in connection with nature and spirituality.

HERBAL BATHS for purification and energetic cleansing.


STORYTELLING of traditional Yawanawa tales.
